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FOREWORD

It was just another beautiful starry night. No one realized the events that had been put in motion that would change the course of history. This musical explores the events of Jesus' birth from the perspective of the ones who were there for the whole story: the animals! We know that everything that has breath praises God, and the animals are no exception. As the musical opens, we are introduced to our narrators, Ruthie the donkey and Eleanor the camel. As they narrate, we get to go back and experience the unique perspectives of animals who came in contact with Mary, Joseph and Jesus.

As the action of the story begins, we encounter Gussy Gusselberg and Sandrine, two birds who are observing the busyness of the census. The four calling birds (turned "texting birds") lead a sont, about the feeling that something exciting is about to happen. Gussy and Sandrine realize they can hear something on the wind—a whisper announcing the birth of "long-expected lesus" in a beautiful moment with the hymn "Come, Thou Long-Expected Jesus." Next, we focus on the donkeys as Ruthie remembers how she and her brother were tasked with carrying a young couple that was rumored to have heard from angels and be carrying the Messiah. One of the fun moments in the musical involves the mice and cats in Mousington Inn. These mice and cats are serious actors who take their job seriously, putting "shows" on for the guests at the inn. (Needless to say the guests see only mice running through the inn, and don't realize the preparation these acrors are making for each "show.") As the Innkeeper talks with Mary and Joseph in the background, the mice run through the room mistaking the screams of terror from the guests as shouts or delight. When the Innkeeper takes Mary and Joseph out to the stable, the animals follow in the hopes of continuing their show, eventually becoming the first animals to meet Jesus.

Another one of the highlights happens in the field where Sadie the sheepdog comes out to see why the sheepdogs haven't brought in the flock of sheep, only to find a flock of sheep who have been scared senseless. In typical fashion for these sheep who have always been considered a little... unique, they sing a song expressing their view of the angels' message to the shepherds called "Dude! Yo!" I guarantee your choir will want to be a part of the rapping sheep and sheepdogs!

The musical concludes with a touching moment where all the animals surround the baby Jesus protectively to wap Him in hav and fleece and sing Him a lullaby. It is my hope that this musical will help your kids to learn about the miracle of the Christmas story in a new and fresh way. No matter whether you sing "Meaw to the World!" or "Bark! the Herald Angels Sing!," we are all "Unplowed Ground" of the King, born on Christmas Day. We all can join together and praise Him!

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SCENE 1

(Music begins for "Rad Tidings")

(Lights up on RUTHIE, a donkey, and ELEANOR, a camel, sitting in rocking chairs.)

RUTHIE: (sigh) Another beautiful starry night.

ELEANOR: It truly is, Ruthie. There's something special in the air.

RUTHIE: It reminds me of that night long ago. It's been decades, hasn't it?

ELEANOR: I believe you're right, Ruthie. What a time that was!

RUTHIE: (noticing audience) **Oh, hello.** (nudging ELEANOR) **We have**

ELEANOR: Indeed, we do.

RUTHIE: You know, not everyone has heard the story. Or at least, they

haven't heard it from two animals who were right there when it

happened. Why don't we tell them about it!

ELEANOR: Let's do it!

(ANIMALS stream onstage to sing.)

RUTHIE and ELEANOR: The animals' Christmas story!



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SCENE 2

(Lights up on NARRATORS (Ruthie and Eleanor), sitting in their rocking chairs.)

RUTHIE: Oh, we're a merry bunch! We're not always noticed... but we are

always there.

ELEANOR: (highbrow) Some of us are more... refined than others, but we are

all creatures of our God and King.

RUTHIE: Preach it, friend. (to the audience) I'm sorry. We're going on and

on, and we haven't even introduced ourselves. I'm Ruthia and this

here is Professor Eleanor.

ELEANOR: (to audience) Nice to make your acquaintance. I don't meet too

many non-camel friends, except for my old friend Ruthie here...

RUTHIE: Who you calling old?

ELEANOR: ... and we go way back.

RUTHIE: I guess I shouldn't assume you all know many donkeys either. We

donkeys, we're good workers. We keep our heads down. We mind our own business. But what I'm about to tell you is too important

to keep to oneself.

ELEANOR: Most folks don't even realize that we animals understood the

gravity of it all—a world seeking a Savior. The promise of

Emmanuel. The Hope of the world.

RUTHIE: But let's star from the beginning. This story starts... where many

stories start... with the birds.

90 (Opt. SFX 1 – Sky Ambience)

(Lights lower on NARRATORS, and lights come up center stage on two birds, GUSSY and SANDRINE. GUSSY has binoculars and is intently staring off stage_downward.)

GUSSY: Woahhh, what is going on down there?

SAMDRINE (looking out, in her own world) Don't know, I try to keep my focus

up here—where I can be free to fly and be me! (twirls)

Down there it's so dramatic. Everyone is talking about the census. Census this. Census that. Who's traveling here? Who's traveling

there. It's like, just be free, people.

Just... (closes eyes with wings out and whispers) **BE.**

GUSSY: But can't you feel it? (lifts wing to test the wind) Something's...

different. Egg-citing, if you tweet.

SANDRINE: *Egg-citing? Tou-can* play at that game. (laugh)

(SFX – Birds Flying In)

(Four TEXTING BIRDS enter.)

GUSSY: Hey! It's the four calling birds!

TEXTING BIRD 1: Actually, we prefer texting now.

TEXTING BIRD 2: **Absolutely... no... calling.** (cute) **Text me!**

GUSSY: Okaaay, the four texting birds. Do you feel something different on

the wind?

(Opt. SFX 2 – Text Chime)

TEXTING BIRD 2: (looking down, intently texting on a leaf)

GUSSY: (looks at her expectantly, then realizes he needs to look at his device

a leaf) Oh, you're... texting. Let me get my readers out. (pxxs on

reader glasses)

Ah, different? Yes, different! Like the world is about to change

forever.

(Music begins for "O Tweet, All Ye Faithful")

SANDRINE: (smiling, in her own world) Gussy, we've seen this all before.

Sparrow me the drama—it's just another census!

(The four TEXTING BIRDS circle the stage and flap their wings excitedly.)

Song: O Tweet, All Ye Faithful with Come, Thou Long-Expected Jesus

O Tweet, All Ye Faithful

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TEXTING BIRD 2: Hi, Mr. Gusselberg!

GUSSY: Why, Finchie, is that you? Aren't you grown up! You're just a

chirp off the old block.

SANDRINE: Now that you tweet it, Gussy, there IS something in the air.

GUSSY: Yes! Spread your wings and feel the whisper on the wind.

SANDRINE: (spreading her wings with the birds) You're right! If you stop,

you can feel it...













SCENE 3

ELEANOR: (chuckling) Texting birds! Will wonders never cease!

RUTHIE: I suppose every species has those that are a little... different.

ELEANOR: (to audience) Wait till you meet the sheep. They're very... unique.

RUTHIE: Very. Like, wearing leg warmers on your ears unique.

ELEANOR: Like, bedazzling your humps unique. (they chuckle) But you know

that's what I like about our animal family. No animal is quite the

another.

(ALLISTER enters.)

RUTHIE: Speaking of family—there's my brother, Allister. (calling over to

him as he walks over toward them) Oh, Allister!

ALLISTER: (old and speaking loudly) **Hello, Ruthie, Eleanor.**

RUTHIE: Allister, I was just telling these people about the great Donkey

Trek of 1 B.C.

ALLISTER: (in gray wig, mis-hearing loudly) The great what?

RUTHIE: (raising voice as he is hard of hearing) **CREAT DONKEY TREK of**

1 B.C.

ALLISTER: (yelling) What was really great was the great DONKEY trek of 1

B.C.

RUTHIE: That's what I said! When we carried that young couple.

ALLISTER: That was before my knee surgery. And I still had my teeth. I

remember it like it was yesterday...

WP4 22 (SFX Dream Sequence)

(Lights down of NARRATORS, up on stage, where RUTHIE and ALLISTER take off gray wigs and play their younger selves.)

ALLISTER: Time for a break! The two humans are over getting water from the

well.

RUTHIE: Whew. My legs are tired under that load.

ALMISTER: Not me. I did *Donkey Fit* this morning before I picked them up.

RUTHIE: (chiding) You better watch it with those crazy workout fads, you'll

blow your knee out!

ALLISTER: Please, girl. I'm in excellent shape. I can do 50 burpees with a sack

of gold on my back. So, who are these people we're traveling with

today?

RUTHIE: (lowering her voice) Don't tell anyone, but I heard there was a little

drama surrounding these two.

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ALLISTER: Now remember your place, Ruthie. People trust us with their

secrets, with their personal lives. Donkeys are *the* most trusted animals. We have a reputation to uphold. We'd be out of a job if

we were loose-lipped, (whispering) like sheep.

RUTHIE: (raising her hooves and shrugging) All I know is we are headed

toward Bethlehem. (looking around and whispering) And I heard

the young man say an angel appeared to him.

ALLISTER: (thinking he's figured it out) **Ohhhhhhh! That's why they're**

traveling to Bethlehem! To seek professional help!

RUTHIE: (shrugs) Maybe. He said the angel told him Mary was going to

have a Son who would save His people from their sins! It's not my

business, but that's a lot of pressure to put on a Baby

(Music begins for "The Donkey's Song")

ALLISTER: We shouldn't interfere, our job is to carry them to their

destination faithfully, and that is what we'll do. Just keep your

head down, Ruthie.

(RUTHIE, ALLISTER and other DONKEYS walk to the beat, with heads down and arms hanging in front.)

ALLISTER: Now, Ruthie. Let's keep going on to Bethlehem.

(MARY and JOSEPH join the DONKEYS and travel with them around the stage.)











SCENE 4

(SETTING: Mousington Inn, an inn in Bethlehem. See Production Notes for set ideas.)

(The two mice (SQUEAKERS and MUFFY) and the cat (CHAZ) are standing around, waiting for the next show at Mousington Inn. CHAZ is stretching his legs, while also doing vocal warmups, and limbering his mouth. MUFFY is nervously pacing.)

SQUEAKERS: Attention! It's half past a muffin crumb and almost time for the next shift.

(looking at the schedule) Who's in the cast for this afternoon

MUFFY: (excitable) It's me and Chaz.

CHAZ: (stuffy) Chaz and I...

MUFFY: (speaking quickly) My bad. I always get you cats mixed up. I

thought you were Chaz.

CHAZ: I am Chaz. I was correcting your gram.

MUFFY: ... cracker? I'd love one, thank you

CHAZ: (hand to his head) I'm surrounded by amateurs!

SQUEAKERS: Thank you to some of our older thespian actors here at

Mousington Inn (nodding towards CHAZ) for being willing to work the show with some of our younger performers (indicating MUFFY). The two of you will be performing the first few acts together today (pointing out the route) Muffy, you'll run through

here, do two circles, and then head back to hole 145.

MUFFY: (about to barst with nervous energy) I'm so excited to work with

you, Nr. Chaz. I do want to let you know (giggles) that I'm a little bloated today, so I may not be able to run as fast as I normally would (giggles) If you wouldn't mind slowing down around the corner of the chair leg, it would make the performance more

believable.

CYAZ: Or I could just... catch you.

(EVERYONE freezes, stunned silence.)

CHAZ: Hahahaha—a little theatre joke!

(MICE giggle awkwardly.)

SQUEAKERS: Okay, that's enough! We have a show to put on. Our job is to provide entertainment for the guests at the inn.

(INNKEEPER woman enters.)

SQUEAKERS: Ooh, there's the innkeeper. That's our cue. Ready? Chaz? Muffy? And, curtain!

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MUFFY: Squeak! Squeak! Squeak!

(MUFFY runs a squiggly line around the stage, exaggerating looking scared. CHAZ runs behind.)

MUFFY: Squeak! Squeak! Squeak! Squeak!

Squeak! Squeak! Squeak!

CHAZ: Meoooow!

NNKEEPER: (screams) **Eek!** (walks off stage) (door slams)

(All MICE and CATS and CHOIR clap as CHAZ stops and takes a grand bow, helping MUFFY do the same.)

SQUEAKERS: (walking up to CHAZ, who is alone on side of stage, stretching) **Great** run, Chaz.

CHAZ: Thank you, but I thought it was a little... uneven. Hopefully our new little mouse was just getting warmed up. I didn't even break a sweat.

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SQUEAKERS: (walking to center, to everyone) **Great first show, everyone.** (looking at his notes and pointing) **Chaz, give me a little more speed.**

CHAZ: But I...

SQUEAKERS: (pointing) And Muffy, just stay loose, you're doing great. Act 2 is

about to start.

(MARY, JOSEPH enter with INNKEEPER to side of stage.)

SQUEAKERS: Here they are, new customers! Ready, set, and curtain!

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(MUFFY again runs the same circle around the stage, chased by CHAZ, but is more tired.)

MUFFY:

Squeak! Squeak! Squeak! (breathing heavily)

Squeak! Squeak! Squeak! (out of breath, breathing hard and holding her side)

Squeak! SQUAWK! ... SQUAWK! ...

Squeak! Squeak! ...

(As MUFFY rounds for her second circle, she turns around and motions for CHAZ to slow down, and CHAZ grudgingly does, a few different times, until they are almost walking. Meanwhile, the INNKEEPER begins pantomiming on the side of the stage with MARY and JOSEPH. The HUMANS do not notice the cat and mouse show. At the conclusion, the PERFORMERS bow and choir claps more hesitantly.)

MUFFY: (breathing heavily) Thanks for slowing down, man.

CHAZ: (incredulous) That. Was. Humiliating. We were practically

walking!

MUFFY: (noticing that the humans aren't looking) **Aww, they didn't even**

notice us!

 $\label{eq:squeakers: They seem preoccupied. I overheard the innkeeper telling them$

that the inn is full!

(Music begins for "Mousington Inn")

MUFFY: (joking) Of course it's full! Full of mice!

(ALL giggle.)

(As song begins, it is clear that the INNKEEPER is trying to explain that there is no room, but JOSEPH and MARY are explaining their need of a place to stay.)

Song: Mousington Inn

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(SQUEAKERS steps forward to announce the cast as CHAZ walks up, greets his fans, and bows. MUFFY standing on the side of the stage, is not used to being introduced and takes a big bite of a mini muffin.)

SQUEAKERS: In today's cast we are pleased to be featuring our theatre's

leading cat. Chaz.

(halsely humble) It's a pleasure just to be nominated. CHAZ:

And the newest mouse actor, Muffy! **SQUEAKER**

MUFFY cought eating a muffin) MFHNMM!

I've caught her with her mouth full. Maybe save the food till after SOUEAKER the show! Ha, ha, ha.

> Well, ladies and gentlemen, that's our lineup for today, and let's get on with the show!

(The INNKEEPER begins leading MARY and JOSEPH off stage.)

MUFFY: Hey! The audience is leaving.

SQUEAKERS: Excuse me, ladies and gentlemen, we're not done yet!

CHAZ: It looks like they are leading the customers out to the stable.

SQUEAKERS: You heard it, folks, we're moving the show out to the stable!

(All MICE and cats follow MARY and JOSEPH and INNKEEPER as they walk briefly offstage and then back on to the "stable.")













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SCENE 5

(SETTING: A field near Bethlehem)

RUTHIE: (in a spot) Meanwhile, in a dark field near Bethlehem, it had been

no ordinary night for a bunch of sheepdogs and their flock.

ELEANOR: Now, remember what we told you about those sheep. They're a

little... (makes a crazy face) woohoo! (spot goes off but she remains,

watching)

(Lights go down on RUTHIE and ELEANOR and up on sheep (BEULAH and DAVEY) and sheepdogs (HARPER and SADIE) center stage.)

HARPER: (walking up) Sadie, Father wants to know why you haven't brought

the sheep back yet. You're hours behind. We sheep togs have to

stay on schedule.

(SADIE the sheepdog, stands, frozen with big, wide eyes. BEULAH is lying flat on her back, having fainted, but holding a rolled-up magazine in her hand. DAVEY is curled up in a ball.)

HARPER: Hellooooo. (waving hand over her face. Sadie. Why is Davey curled

up in a ball? And why is Beulah lying down like that? Beulah, are you ill? Speak to me, Beulah. (we wing hand over her frozen face

again) Nothin'.

SADIE: Grrr. Grrr.

HARPER: Sadie! Good girl Use your bark!

SADIE: (suddenly chasing her tail in a circle) Ruff! Ruff! Ruff! Ruff! Ruff!

(pants) Ruff Ruff! Ruff!

HARPER: Spit it out, Sadie Was it a wolf?

SADIE: (still too scared to talk) Rrruff!

HARPER: Okay, I've seen this before. Let's charade it up.

(to SADIE and DAVEY) Give me a clue, guys.

(DA EY gets up tentatively and lifts an arm.)

There you go, Davey. Was it a wolf?

(DAVEY flaps arms like a bird.)

Okay, you're flapping your arms. It was a bird, then.

(DAVEY shakes his head no.)

No? I'm sorry, I'm not getting it.

(BEULAH comes to and jumps up and karate chops with the magazine she's holding. DAVEY the sheep is still flapping his arms.)

BEULAH: (loudly) **Hi-ya! I'm okay!**

HARPER: Beulah! You're up!

BEULAH: Of course I'm up. Why was I lying down?

HARPER: That's what I'm trying to figure out. What's the last thing you

remember?

BEULAH: (looking at the magazine she is still holding as a weapon) I was

reading my Vanity Fur magazine, minding my own business, when

suddenly I saw...

HARPER: (interested) ... something flying?

BEULAH: SOMETHING flying? Try HUNDREDS of things flying!

(BEULAH begins pacing back and forth.)

HARPER: Birds?!

BEULAH: (talking to herself) I mean, I'm not crazy. I feel fine. Sharp as a

tack.

HARPER: Beulah. WERE. THERE. BIRDS?

BEULAH: (ignoring him, still in her own dialogue, encouraging herself) I am a

strong, capable sheep. I am a strong, capable sheep.

HARPER: You're not making any sense And Davey is just flapping. What

happened?

SADIE: (finally speaks softly) A fright...

HARPER: (leading her) . in the night...

BEULAH: (excitedly agreeing) That's what it was! A fright in the night!

HARPER: The birds, ... (alarmed) they, they ATTACKED you?!

BEULAH: No birds!

BEULAH: It was a fright in the night! And they said...

HARPER. (excitedly leaning in) What did they say?

DAVEY: (stops flapping and finally speaks) Ra-a-a-ad tidings!

HARPER (taken aback) What? That's what they said?

PAVEY: Ra-a-ad tidings!

HARPER: (makes a doubting face) That doesn't sound right to me. You better

tell us more.

Song: Dude! Yo!

Dude! Yo!



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HARPER: What did they say? Something about... tidings?

BEULAH: Sit down, Harrier. Let us tell you what we saw.

(RAP ANGEL comes out and lip syncs the story as BEULAH and DAVEY rap it.)




(RAP ANGEL exits.)

SADIE: Actually, I don't remember them using those words.

BEULAH: Nope, that was it!

SADIE: (doubtfully) I remember it more like this...







HARPER: (expectantly waits) Is that what you sheep heard?

BEULAH/DAVEY: (smiling and shaking head) Na-a-a-ah.

(RAP ANGEL comes out and sings with choir.)













SCENE 6

(Lights up on NARRATORS at side of stage.)

RUTHIE: (smiling) We did tell you the sheep were a bit... unique.

ELEANOR: But you know, those sheep and their sheepdogs ran to Bethlehem,

just like the angels told them to.

RUTHIE: What a story!

ELEANOR: Now remember, my story was a little different. I was in Persia,

honored to be serving with some Wise Men.

RUTHIE: They were honored to be serving with a wise camel like you. I'm

sure!

ELEANOR: You're too kind, Ruthie.

RUTHIE: Just telling it like it is. I've never met a sharper mind than

yours, Eleanor. Tell our friends what you and the Magi had been

studying.

ELEANOR: The Magi we were traveling with had noticed an extraordinary

new star. Their studies of ancient prophecies led them to believe a new King had been born. So, they decided to devote years of travel to go find this special King—even though it was a *difficult* journey.

RUTHIE: You know, the scriptures tell us to seek the Lord with all our

hearts.

ELEANOR: And not just when it's easy. Seeking the King takes work... and

action. There's a scripture in Hosea 10:12 that says, "Break up

your unployed ground, for it is time to seek the Lord."

RUTHIE: We know from our friends who plow the earth that it takes work

to plow the ground, but it's necessary so that seeds can grow.

God wants His people to dig up the things in their lives that hold

them back from serving Him!

(CAMELS come out and lead song.)

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SCENE 7

(The ANIMALS enter the stable where MARY and JOSEPH are sitting, with BABY JESUS in a manger.)

SQUEAKERS: All right, everyone, come on in quietly. Let's not disturb the Baby.

SANDRINE: We're so honored to be here.

4 TEXTING BIRDS: We need to give this baby King the royal tweetment! (giggle)

MUFFY: Wait, a King? I thought this was just a cute little baby!

BEULAH: (excitedly joining in) No! Cuz the angel said, "Dude! Yo!"

(EVERYONE stops briefly)

CHAZ: (pause) What does that have to do with anything?

SADIE: What she means is, the angel told us that this Baby is the Savior!

ALLISTER: That's heehawesome news!

GUSSY: And we heard it on the wind! It was flap ustic!

MUFFY: Squeak, squeak merrily on high I can't believe we have a King in

Mousington Inn!

CHAZ: (correcting) Mousington Stable

(All ANIMALS sing at the manger.)

SCENE 8

(Lights come back up on the two NARRATORS on side of stage.)

RUTHIE: And there it is—the animals' Christmas story.

ELEANOR: I wish I could have been there with you all that first night. After

we saw the star, we traveled with the Magi for *years* until that star led us right to young Jesus with His parents. (smiling) I'll never

forget that.

RUTHIE: (smiling) Oh, I forgot to tell you. My grandson, Garison, had a
