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FOREWORD

I am delighted to introduce you to the musical, *The Kingdom Connection*. When you step into The Kingdom Connection, the Bible comes to life! You leave the modern world behind and enter into the ancient world of kings who lived over 2000 years ago! We will be able to peek in on a few definition moments in Bible history, and learn from the lives and choices of these kings.

Kate, Loren and Josiah are visiting an interactive adventure at The Kinadom Connection Museum for the first time. As they walk through the museum they meet various biblical kings, including King David and King Solomon, as well as less popular characters like King Herod and King Saul. As we learn from their life stories and the choices each king made, the Rids are preparing for The Kingdom Quiz that is held at the end of their museum visit. While Kate and Loren are excited to test the knowledge they have learned, Josiah only cares about "acing the test" and secreby tries to get answers from King Herod, thinking he will come out on top! Unfortunately, the advice he received from the actor playing King Herod was from the perspective of the actual king, and not the answer needed for the final quiz question. We learn that the successful kings in the Bible were plugged into the power of God and sought God's wisdom.

It is my hope and prayer that each child who sings these songs will learn God's truths displayed through the lives of these kings. May our kids learn to have a heart that seeks after God by allowing God's Spirit to dwell in them!

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SCENE 1

(music begins to "The Kingdom Connection")

(As the lights come up on stage, we see the interior of The Kingdom Connection Bible Museum. Ms. Knight, the docent, escorts the game players into the Kings Room where museum actors are frozen in statuelike poses on pedestals. The museum actors join the game-playing kids in song.)



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MS. KNIGHT: (begin at m. 47) When you step into The Kingdom Connection, you leave the modern world behind and enter into the ancient world of kings who lived over 2000 years ago! We will be able to peek in on a few defining moments in Bible history . . . one king at a time! Throughout the experience, you will have the opportunity to guess what you think happened next!













SCENE 2

MS. KNIGHT: Hello, everyone! Welcome to your Interactive Bible Adventure Tour—The Kingdom Connection. Let me tell you how it works. The kings will start out frozen in statue poses as the narrator tells their stories. The actors playing these kings will remain in character—which means if you ask them a question, they will answer you as if they really are the kings of old.

LOREN: (excited, intense and a bit nerdy) I am so ready for this! Ancient stories are my jam! #BibleNerd.*

KATE: She's not joking. In second grade, she made a full-scale model of the Tower of Babel . . . complete with sound effects. Freaked everyone out.

MS. KNIGHT: Impressive! And oddly ambitious . . .

JOSIAH: (confidently) I heard there's a challenge at the end, right? That's why I'm here.

MS. KNIGHT: Yes, that's correct; a quiz at the end.

LOREN: Oooh...I've been vaiting for The Kingdom Quiz. Ask me anything ... anything at all. Who was the youngest king in Israel's history? King Josiah! He was crowned at age eight. Eight! Can you believe it?

JOSIAH: Well-my name's Josiah, so that puts me ahead already. Up top! (high-free a friend)

KATE: (lighthearted and matter of fact) I see this is going to be competitive. I'd better take notes. (takes out a small pad of paper)

M8. KNGHS: I think we are ready to begin! ([7] EYE2] SFX: "Saul Is Chosen [Underscore 1]", page 16) [King Saul and Rosie (dressed as Samuel) come out and freeze in statue poses.] Our adventure begins with the story of our first king, King Saul.

NARRATOR: Before Saul, Israel had never had a king, but instead had followed the people God had chosen to lead them—like Moses, Joshua and Samuel. But when Samuel grew old, (music ends) the elders of Israel gathered together and said...

Saul Is Chosen (Underscore 1)



KID 1: (spunky) You are old!!!! Give us a king, like all the other nations!!

ROSIE: (as Samuel with a beard) But the Lord – He is your King.

(8 music begins to "We Want a King")

We want to be like everyone else! We want a king we can see, to lead us and fight our battles.

We Want a King



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NARRATOR: (during song, meas. 25) And the Lord told him, "Listen to them, Samuel; it is not you they have rejected, but they have rejected me. I will choose their King."





NARRATOR: (during song, meas. 39) So Samuel addressed the people:

ROSIE

(as SAMUEL): The Lord will choose your king, but take care not to turn away from the Lord, but serve him with all your heart. "For the Lord will not abandon His people on account of His great name." (1 Samuel 12:22)











SCENE 3

NARRATOR: And so God gave the Israelites a king named Saul.

(13) SFX: "Fanfare 1") (Saul comes out and takes his position)



Now Saul was very, very handsome. (Sail poses with a cheesy grin; opt. 56 SFX: Saul's Pearly Whites*) In fact, there was not a more handsome man than he among the soils of Srael.

SAUL: (unfreezing) There was not a more handsome man than me among

the sons of Israel. (smiles) (56 opt SFX: Saul's Pearly Whites*)

NARRATOR: Then Samuel took a flask of onve oil and poured it on Saul's head.

ROSIE: (pantomimes fouring the contents of a small bottle over Saul's head)

The Spirit of the Lord will come powerfully upon you . . . Once these signs are fulfilled, do whatever your hand finds to do, for God

is with you. (characters freeze)

NARRATOR: And God changed Saul's heart . . . and the Spirit of God came upon

him mightily.

MS. KNICKT: Once Samuel assembled all the tribes of Israel to announce Saul as

king, what do you think Saul did?

Ooh, ooh, I know. He . . . he gave a big speech to the people!

AS. KNIGHT: Let's see what happened. (motions for the actors to proceed. Samuel

starts to talk and Saul hides behind the pedestal)

ROSIE: And I present to you all the one the Lord has chosen: Sau-(looks

around) Where did he go?

NARRATOR: Saul was hiding behind the luggage.

ROSIE: Saul, get out here! Ahem. This is who the Lord has chosen! Long

live the king!

NARRATOR/

ROSIE: Long live the king!

SAUL: Long live me! (smiles) (56 opt. SFX: Saul's Pearly Whites*)

(Rosie exits to put on Goliath costume)

MS. KNIGHT: Does anyone have any questions for King Saul?

JOSIAH: (making fun) Why did you hide behind the luggage? Were you

scared?

SAUL: (pause) Pass.

JOSIAH: Pass? You can't pass.

SAUL: I was just . . . resting. I wasn' afraid of being king. That's it. Next

question?

KATE: (raising hand) How long were you king?

SAUL: Forty-two years It would have been longer, but someone stole my

throne.

JOSIAH: Are you kidding me? That's messed up! I would have pounded him.

SAUL: Liried Believe me, I tried! But he kept escaping.

JOSIAH: Tough break, man.

SAUL: (milking it) It really was . . .

(raising her hand and talking) Uh, excuse me. Saul didn't obey all the rules that God gave him! Here in (looking it up) 1 Samuel 15:10-11 it says: "Then the word of the Lord came to Samuel, saying, 'I regret that I have made Saul king, for he has turned back from following Me and has not carried out My commands.'" So God replaced Saul

with a man who would listen to God. And that man was David!

SAUL: (agreeing) Like I said . . . someone stole my throne!

JOSIAH: (to Loren) You brought your own Bible?

LOREN: You didn't?

(14) music begins to "Samuel Anoints David [Underscore 2]") (Actors switch places. David stands on pedestal and freezes. Saul exits.)

Samuel Anoints David (Underscore 2)



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NARRATOR: God told Samuel to anoint young David. And the Spirit of the Lord

came mightily upon David from that day forward. (music ends)

JOSIAH: Bor-ing Are we getting to the good ol' David and Goliath story yet?

MS. KNIGHT: Indeed, we are. The Philistines had a champion fighter named Goliath.

ROSIE: (jumps out into the scene triumphantly with a Goliath helmet and sword) GRRR!

ATE: Isn't that the same person who played Samuel?

MS. KNIGHT: (whispering) Rosie actually plays a number of the supporting roles.

Now she is Goliath.

KATE: (approving) Cool!

NARRATOR: (15 music begins to "Goliath's Underscore [Underscore 3],"

p. 30]) Goliath was HUGE and had advanced armor and weapons.

Every day he stood and shouted:

ROSIE:

(in a deep voice as Goliath) Choose a man and have him come down to me. If he is able to fight and kill me, we will become your subjects; but if I overcome him, you will become our subjects and serve us. (characters freeze) (music ends)



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JOSIAH: Ooh, I know! He fought Goliath and stuff.

MS. KNIGHT: Let's watch and see.

DAVID: (unfreezes) You come to me with a sword and a spear (16 27 music begins to "Not My Battle"), but I come to you in the name of the Lord . . . that all the earth may know that there is a God in

Israel. For the battle is the Lord's, and He will give you into our

hands.

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SCENE 4

(As song ends, actors freeze in statue poses again, with David in a "victory pose" over Goliath.)

NARRATOR: And David defeated the Philistine with a sling and a stone. (kids

cheer)

JOSIAH: So this David was just crazy strong. I guess that makes sense.

LOREN: Nope, that's not it. God used David because he had a heart that was

surrendered to Him—not because he was strong.

KATE: (taking notes) Don't volunteer to fight giants unless you know that

God wants you to. Got it!

LOREN: Throughout the Bible, God uses lots of people who aren't really

strong or super smart.

JOSIAH: (mocking) You'd fit in great.

LOREN: (not offended) Don't be sink!

MS. KNIGHT: Come on now! Let's continue with our— (21 SFX: Lunch

Break Buzzer)

SAUL: (steps out onto stage LUNCH BREAK!! (all actors immediately

unfreeze and all talk at once as they walk off)

MUSEUM

ACTORS: Already? Wonderful! I was getting hungry! Finally! I need to use

the little king's room! etc.


MS. KNICHT: (apologetic) I'm sorry. It's a union thing. You really don't want hungry kings. It's not pretty. (Actors continue to walk offstage to

lunch, chatting excitedly)

These people are serious about their food.

MS. KNIGHT: I'll see you back in an hour. (She walks away quickly)

(Kid walks by with a sign that says "One hour later")



MS. KNIGHT: (22 SFX: "Fanfare 2") Welcome back! Let's look into the next kingdom.

LOREN: (excited) Ooh, the next king! Is it Ahab? Omri? Jeh shaphat?

KATE: (as if she had sneezed) God bless you.

LOREN: (deadpan) Jehoshaphat.

KATE: Bless you again.

LOREN: **Je - . . . never mind.**

(David enters and poses with a harp) (23 10 music begins for "David's Underscore [Underscore 4]," p. 43)

David's Underscore (Underscore 4)



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MS. KNIGHT: David was accospering in all his ways, for the Lord was with him.

DAVID:

The Lord is my Rock, my Fortress and my Deliverer; He rescued me from my foes, who were too strong for me. "The Lord lives! Praise be to my Rock! I will praise you, Lord, among the nations; I will sing the praises of your name. (music ends)

NARRATOR: David wrote psalms to God when he was happy, when he was sad, and when he was afraid.

MS. KNIGHT: I need two volunteers to help read some of the psalms David wrote. (Loren and Kate raise hands) How about you two?

KATE: Awesome! Psalm 34:17-19 "The righteous cry out, and the Lord hears them; the Lord is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit."

MS. KNIGHT: How did David feel when he wrote that?

KATE: He sounds pretty sad.

MS. KNIGHT: Yes!

LOREN: (after Ms. Knight motions for her to read) Psalm 32:7 "You are my

hiding place; you will protect me from trouble and surround me with songs of deliverance." Maybe he wrote this when he was

scared!

KATE: Psalm 28:7 "The Lord is my strength and my shield; my heart

trusts in him, and I am helped. My heart leaps for juy and I will give

thanks to him in song."

MS. KNIGHT: What do you think about that one?

KATE: He was thankful!

(24 PP11 music begins to I Will Hope")

MS. KNIGHT: Yes, but the most important thing about David is that he had a humble heart. He loved God and trusted Him. David loved to sing

to God with all his heart.

(David exits when song ends.)

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SCENE 5

MS. KNIGHT: But not all the kings in the Bible were seeking to please God.

LOREN: Tell me about it! There was Nadab, Tibni, Joash, Ahab-

JOSIAH: (interrupts) Blah, blah, blah. Stop being a "know it all." There are

other people here.

LOREN: (embarrassed) Oh, sorry. When I get excited about something, it all

just spills out!

MS. KNIGHT: It's quite all right. Let's journey forward a bit into the next

kingdom.

HEROD/

AUDREY: (in a highly-effected British accent) I am the greatest king in all the

land! King Herod!

(28 SFX: "Fanfare 3") (Hexad enters. It is clearly a girl [Audrey] wearing a Herod costume.)



MS. KNIGHT: (confused) King Herod? Audrey, where is our regular King Herod?

HEROD: (staying in character) Sometimes, in the course of kingdom events, certain kings get sick and other certain understudies get a big break


performing in their place!

ALL: Huh?

HEROD: (breaking character) Herod has a fever. I'm Herod's understudy.

(back to character) And I'm the greatest king this land has ever

seeeennn! (29 **29** 13 SFX: "Fanfare 4")



KATE: Was King Herod British?

HEROD: Sometimes understudies only know one accent.

KATE: **Ohhhhh...**

NARRATOR: King Herod was happily reigning over the land when he heard a

commotion about a baby king being born during his reign.

HEROD: (disturbed) What? Another ruler has been born here? There can't

be another king! (motioning towards person in the distance) Go and make a careful search for the child. As soon as you find him, report to me, so that I may go and ... may go and ... (she has

forgotten her line)

LOREN: Psst! Worship him

HEROD: (normal voice?) What?

LOREN: Worship him! Herod was pretending he wanted to worship the baby

Jesus, although we all know he really wanted to kill Him!

HEROD (Back into character) Ahem. No one can prove that.

No offense, but I don't think it's a secret.

(continuing) As soon as you find the baby, report to me so I may go and worship him. (snaps and nods to Loren) Really, let me know-I could throw him a big party or something, too! (30 per 14 music begins to "Only One King") My event planning resources are

limitless here at the palace!



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SCENE 6

MS. KNIGHT: Does anyone have any questions for King Herod?

JOSIAH: I do! But may I ask Herod in private?

MS. KNIGHT: Well, normally our questions are-

HEROD: (staying in character) I'd be happy to answer this fine fellow's

question privately! Wait . . . (suspiciously) you're not a king, are

you?

JOSIAH: Eh, no.

MS. KNIGHT: Alright, whatever King Herod says! That's what's so exciting about

our interactive adventure; every tour is different!

JOSIAH: (under his breath to Herod) I'm looking for something.

HEROD: Just what might you be seeking, young han? Surely not a baby king

... because I haven't had much luck in that area.

JOSIAH: No. The answer to the quiz at the end—I just need a boost to help

me ace it.

HEROD: (staying in character) Ahhh . . . a little help to claim your rightful

place as the ruler of all the land. (dramatically) Listen, all you have to do is study the stars. My advisors always use the stars to solve their difficult problems. Now, run along. I have kingly matters to

attend to.


JOSIAH: (confused) The stars? I meant, like, do you have a cheat sheet or something? (thinking) Stars? Stars . . . I guess "the stars" is the

answer to the final question. Awesome! Thanks! (He runs off.)

(Calling after him out of corner of her mouth) Um, you know I'm just an actor, not a real bad guy, right? I was just staying in charac—

(34) SFX: "Fanfare 5," p. 64) (Solomon jumps on stage and

poses as Herod leaves).



MS. KNIGHT: And we move on from King Herod to someone who had a very important role in the Bible. This king was very wise. Does anyone know who he was?

KATE: Was it Solomon?

NARRATOR: The Lord appeared to Solomon in a dream, and God said, "Ask for whatever you want Me to give you." Solomon answered:

SOLOMON: "You have shown great kindness to my father, David, because he was faithful to you. Your chosen people are very great, but I don't know how to lead them. Please give me wisdom to know right from wrong." (character freezes) (music ends)

NARRATOR: The Lord was pleased that Solomon had asked for this. So God said to him, "Since you have asked for this and not for long life or wealth... I will do what you have asked. I will give you a wise and discerning heart." (1 Kings 3:10, 12)

MS. KNICKT: The Bible says that God gave Solomon great wisdom, insight,

(36 17 music begins to "The Wisdom of God," p. 66)
and understanding as measureless as the sand on the seashore. Men of all nations came to listen to Solomon's wisdom!

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SOLOMON: (during song, meas. 60) "Lord my God, you have made me king. But I am only a little child and do not know what to do... So give me a discerning heart to govern your people and to distinguish between right and wrong." (1 Kings 3:9a)

SCENE 7







MS. KNIGHT: Is everyone ready now to participate in The Kingdom Quiz? Actors,

take your places. (42 music begins to "The Kingdom Quiz [Underscore 6]," page 77). (All actors line up in their poses and freeze) Players, step forward and bring your whiteboards. Write your answers down after each character asks the question. After all characters have spoken, you may reveal your answers.

HEROD: Question 1: What did I tell the Wise Men I wanted to do with the

baby king?

A. Dance with him (All giggle)

That's what it says!

B. Crown him the new king

C. Worship him

(kids furiously write answers, but don't reveal yet)

JOSIAH: Oh, I got this in the bag!

LOREN: Yes!

DAVID: Question 2: When did I write psalms of worship and praise to God?

A. When I was scared

B. When I was than ful C. When I was sad

D. All of the above

SAUL: Question 3. Why did God choose another king to replace me?

A. Because he was better looking. Doubtful!

B. Because I disobeved God's rules . . . or

S. Because I couldn't handle the pressure

(Kids write heir answers on their white boards)

This is "open note," right?

MS. KNIGHT: If you took notes, yes, you may use them. (Kids write answer)

KATE: Perfect!

SOLOMON: Question 4: What did I ask God for?

A. Long life

B. Wisdom . . . or

C. Wealth

(music ends) (Kids write answers on their whiteboards)

ALL KINGS: How can we have a heart that seeks God rather than a heart that seeks its own gain?

MS. KNIGHT: Please write your answers down. You have 15 seconds.

JOSIAH: (smiling and overacting) Oh, I have noooo idea what this answer is! (whispering) Thanks for the help, Herod. (returns to acting dramatically) This is sooo hard!

HEROD: (in character) Young man, I think you possibly misunderstood what I was saying earlier—

MS. KNIGHT: **Pens down.** (music ends) **Now, reveal your answers. The answers are:** (Kids display their answers on the whiteboards. Each kid's board is identical and reads C, D, B, E. For the final question, Josiah's board says "The Stars," and Kate and Loren's says "God's Spirit living in us.")

HEROD: C. Worship Rim

DAVID: D. All of the above

SAUL: Because disobeyed God's rules

SOLOMON: B. Wisdom

MS. KNISYA: And the answer to the final question is-

JOSIAH: (blurting out) The stars! The answer is the stars!

(57 opt. SFX: Game Show Buzzer*)

MS. KNIGHT: I'm sorry, but the answer to "How can we have a heart that seeks God rather than a heart that seeks its own gain?" is . . .

ALL KINGS: God's Spirit living in you!

JOSIAH: But Herod said the answer was "the stars"! I asked her before!

^{*}On the accompaniment DVD, refer to opt. SFX (audio) on Data Disc 2.

HEROD: (normal voice) I'm afraid you misunderstood; I was in character

acting like King Herod. I would never cheat and give away the

answer.

JOSIAH: Aaaugh! Figures. This is a dumb activity anyway.

KATE: It's okay, Josiah. You did great! We are all learning.

JOSIAH: But you did great all on your own. You didn't need to cheat!

KATE: But Josiah, we aren't living on our own. Ever since we gave our lives

to Jesus, He lives inside us!

LOREN: Lots of kings thought they could do it all on their own, and they

ended up failing. God says the only way we can have wisdom and strength to live a life that pleases Him is through the power of His

Spirit living within us!

(44) 20 music begins to "Only Jesus On," p. 80)

KATE: What was impossible with man is possible with God!

LOREN: Jesus conquered the powers of darkness, defeating death on the

cross. And now we are free and can live with His Spirit in us every

day!

LOREN: But first you need to know Jesus— (50 wusic begins

to "He Is the King with The Kingdom Connection," p 90) He is our connection to God's Kingdom. Because of His sacrifice, we can experience the Kingdom of God, both now and in Heaven!!! Jesus

is our King! And that's The Kingdom Connection!
