FOREWORD



I am so thrilled to introduce the musical, *Wrapping All the Way* to you and your kids! I am *extra* excited about this title because, as you may know, I enjoy some good rapping (and as much as I enjoy it, I believe our kids enjoy it even more).

It will be great fun for your choirs to transform into "Tunies," the townspeople in our whimsical story who love Christmas so much that they celebrate it every single day...so much so that they speak in Christmas phrases. But in Tuneville, the glitz and the glamor of the celebration gradually becomes more important than the true meaning behind Christmas. As the town's "Tinsel Mania" celebration comes to a crashing half because of a Sleigh Bell Storm, the Tunies are left searching for hope when their plans have failed.

Tansy (the Christmas wrapper/rapper) and her brother Filbert remind King Dazzlebaum and the town that Christmas can be celebrated without all the tinsel glitter and lights. With their catchy combo of rhythm and (w) rap. Tallsy and Filbert teach that we can celebrate and worship the Prince of Peace in many ways. From that moment on, each day the Tunies remembered God's great gift of light to a dark world, and the promise of hope to every heart that longs for peace. And, as a song in the musical says, "Our tiny town of Tuneville began to shine even brighter."

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PRODUCTION NOTESIOO

SCENE 1

(1) music begins to "It's Christmas Every Day")

(As the lights come up on stage, the "Tunies," dressed in overthe-top Christmas attire, sing and laugh as they decorate a Christmassy town square. They use Christmas lyrics and holiday phrases as part of their everyday vocabulary. They are busy preparing for Christmas and their monthly musical showcas. Tinsel Mania. All the kids are busy singing and laughing as they work.)

STORYTELLER 1: Our story begins in a tiny town called Tuneville.

STORYTELLER 2: You see, the Tunies of Tuneville loved Christmas so dearly, they thought it was a mistake just to have it once a yearly!

STORYTELLER 1: The carols, the candy, the tinsel, the lights—all were so beloved that the King of Tanevale decided to show the world they loved Christmas with all their hearts.

STORYTELLER 2: So one day, King Dazzlehaum made a decree that Christmas would be celebrated daily, a national pastime for the citizens of Tuneville.

STORYTELLERS: Now, every day is Christmas Day!

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SCENE 2

(A wrapping booth is set up in the town square called "Wrapping with Tansy." A sign points off to the side saying, "Tuneville Town Hall")

ANGELINA: (Calling to her friend across the town square) Merry Christmas,

Brianca!

BRIANCA: Merry Christmas to you, too! How has your day been?

ANGELINA: (cheerily) Ever so merry and bright. (Offering her a candy

cane) Candy cane?

BRIANCA: (taking candy cane) Sure, thanks! How are rehearsals coming

along? I've really been enjoying the new dance routines. They

are nut-crack-tastic!!

ANGELINA: You know, for my first time directing Tinsel Mania, it is

going so smoothie-smooth! We have more lights than ever, you "Dasher Dancers" have spectacular new moves, and the "Silent Night Light Show" will be a show-stopper! I predict that this will be the brightest Tinsel Mania ever! Are you

headed to dress rehearsal?

BRIANCA: Yes, but first I need to get these gifts wrapped. (waving

goodbye) Fa la la la la!

ANGELINA: See you over the river and through the woods at the Town

Hall! (She exits)

BRIAN(A: (approaching) Good tidings, Sparky! What's in the bag?

SPARKY. (pulling out of a plastic bag) A gingerbread game for my

brother.

BRIANCA: Oh, what fun! His eyes will be all aglow!

SPARKY: I hope so!

BRIANCA: I made this candy cane case for my mom! (to Tansy in the


gift wrapping booth) I'd like it wrapped in that . . . (choosing)

glittery gold paper.

TANSY: No problem. Filbert, the 5 Golden Rings Package, please.

FILBERT: Coming right up!

(Tansy and Filbert slap out a beat with the paper and boxes, rapping a cappella) (6 W2 "Wrap It Up - Rap 1")

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The actor does not need to actually wrap the present, but replaces the box with a duplicate that is perfectly wrapped.)

BRIANCA:

Wow, that was speedy. Thank you. Tidings of good cheer!

SPARKY

Season's greetings, Brianca! I'll see you at the show tonight! (to Tansy) I'd like this gift wrapped with cheer . . . (choosing) in that green and red paper, please!

TANSY:



FILBERT: All done! (bulling out a duplicate box that is perfectly wrapped)

T COPY THIS MUSIC.

SPARKY: Have yourself a merry little Christmas!

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FILBERT: God bless us, every one!

STORYTELLER IS So Sparky and Brianca ran off to prepare for Tinsel Mania, and all was well.

STORY NAZER 2: Tansy, the Christmas Wrapper, worked at the family wrapping station with her little brother, Filbert. She was a bit of an oddball because, unlike most of the Tunies of Tuneville, she didn't ever sing.

STORYTELLER 1: And singing was one of the favorite pastimes of the Tunies!

STORYTELLER 2: But Tansy loved rhythms, and Christmas carols that told of Jesus' birth.

(Cuthbert, the royal trumpeter, runs in and blows his trumpet to announce King Dazzlebaum) (8 SFX-Trumpet Fanfare 1)

CUTHBERT: (after blowing) His Royal Highness, King Dazzlebaum!

KING: (entering, very jolly) It's beginning to look a lot like Christmas!

Backup singers! (points with both fingers back behind him)

BACKUP

SINGERS: (The King's backup singers follow him around and sing their lines

like divas, with great stage presence. Optional: Storytellers may

sing backup.) Like Christmas!



Like Christ-mas!

KING: What am I saying? It always looks like Christmas here in

Tuneville! Ha! Could you wrap this gingerbread hat for my sister? (Tansy nods and begins wrapping) Thank you! Backup singers! (points backwards)(9) SFX-Wrapping Package

Loop) (Perc. loop continues for 2 measures)

BACKUP

SINGERS: Thank you!

STORYTELLER 2: (stepping out) Now King Dazzlebaum loved music so much he

had full-time backup singers accompany him everywhere he

yent (Tansy hands him a wrapped gift)

KING: (Turning to his assistant) Cuthbert, please see that this is telivered to the castle. But, be as quiet as a mouse. (points

silently behind)

BACKUP SINGERS

(quietly) Mouse!



Mouse!

CUTHBERT: Yes, Your Christmas-ness. (exits with package)

STORYTELLER 2: Ahem. This brings us back to the story we are telling—

KING: (cutting in) The story of King Dazzlebaum—(King steps forward

proudly)

STORYTELLER 1: Now, wait a minute—

KING: (comically singing and dancing) It's Christmas every day!!

STORYTELLER 2: Pardon me, King Dazzlebaum, but that's not the story we are

telling.

KING: It's not?

STORYTELLER 2: (music begins to "Wrapping All the Way" 10 This is

the story of Tansy, who worked faithfully at the ght wrapping

station in the town square.

KING: *(dubiously) Her?*

STORYTELLER 1: (positive) Her.

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SCENE 3

(17 SFX-Thunder 1)

STORYTELLER 1: But out in the distance a sleigh bell storm was brewing.

STORYTELLER 2: As the sky grew darker, the Tunies bustled about, finishing

their preparations for Tinsel Mania that evening.

FILBERT: (thunder) Oh, the weather outside is frightful! Should we close

up the wrapping station, Tansy?

TANSY: Maybe so . . . it looks a sleigh bell story as a con in'! (Sparky)

and Brianca walk by, carrying two big baxes)

SPARKY: Good tidings! You guys coming to the big Tinsel Mania

tonight?

FILBERT: Peace on earth! We wouldn't miss it!

SPARKY: You're going to love the secret surprise! I've added a new

number with Super Holiday Sparkle. (whispering) I even had

12 tons of glitter shipped here for the closing number!

BRIANCA: And the Dasher Dancers will be doing a spectacular new

routine during the Silent Night Light Show!

SPARKY: Which reminds me, will you two be on the lookout for the

Twelve Drummers Drumming Delivery truck? It should be

arriving any minute. (18 SFX-Thunder 2)

TANSY

I'm afraid nothing's arriving any minute today, Sparky. They

just closed the town bridge on account of the storm!

SPARKY: (panicked) OH, CHRISTMAS TREE! Don't tell me that!

Everything hinges on the glitter delivery! I NEED MY

SPARKLES!

ANGELINA: (running in) Sparky, Brianca! We have a Frosty the Snowman-

sized problem! The rain soaked through the chestnut chimney

and formed a licorice lake on the stage!

BRIANCA: (panicked) What? The Dasher Dancers will have no place

to dance! We can't have Tinsel Mania without the Dasher

Dancers!

(Cuthbert runs on and plays a fanfare to announce King's arrival)

(19) SFX-Trumpet Fanfare 2)

KING: Attention, everyone! Even in this winter wonderland weather,

I know you are excitedly preparing for everyone's favorite Christmas production—Tinsel Mania. Backup Singers. (Starts to sing it with them, not realizing they are not behind him) "Finse

Mani—" Where are my backup singers?

STORYTELLER 1: (apologetically) The King's backup singers had stopped to

purchase umbrellas for the big storm.

KID 1: (frantically running in) Your frosty-ness, the partridges ate all

the pears in a pear tree and got stuck in the figgy pudding!

KING: (frazzled) Again? This is a good of a day!

(Backup singers run to their place behind the king, holding

umbrellas.)

BACKUP

SINGERS: Day!

Day!

KING: (pleased) Oh, there you are!

ANGELINA: How are you all not losing your Christmas cookies? There's a

lake the size of the North Pole on our stage!

SPARKY: (whispering dramatically and sadly) And no glitter!

TANSY: Everything will be fine as fruitcake. We'll close up early and

help you clean it up!

FILBERT: Absolutely! The show will still be merry and bright. (They

gather their wrapping paper supplies.)

KING: (music begins to "Tinsel Mania" [20] [20]) For now, it seems

best that we make like Santa's sleigh and take off! It's time for

(in a dramatic announcer voice) Tinnnselll Maaannia!

(As song begins, characters change the set into Town Hall stage; last minute props are being set up and mics placed, getting ready for the big show.)

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TANSY:

Okay, Angelina, we've mopped up the stage and patched the leak in the chestnut chimney. It should be plum pudding-perfect!

ANGELINA:

Thank you! Everyone reindeer-ready? Curtain up in sixty seconds! Mary, Angel, on stage! (Brianca comes out dressed as an angel, along with Mary) King Dazzlebaum, please take your place center stage.

KING:

(stepping center with a flourish) I'm ready as Rudolph! (In a grand announcer voice) And now, the moment you've all been waiting for . . . welcome to our merry monthly (stretched) "Tinsel Mania!"





(King Dazzlebaum, surrounded by the Dasher Dancers, all take their places for a grand "kickline"!)









SCENE 4

KING:

(Continuing his narration with a personal touch as the show goes on) Ah, Tinsel Mania . . . as most of you know, we Tunies celebrate Christmas year-round here, and this is one of our favorite ways to celebrate the birth of the Baby Jesus. But before we go any further in the celebration, let's take a moment to remember (music begins to "Mary's Song" [26] [26] [11]) how it all started—with a girl named Mary.

NARRATOR:

(meas. 5) An angel came up to Mary and said. "Don't be afraid, I have an important message from the Most Yigh God."

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NARRATOR: Mary couldn't understand what the angel could be talking about. Her? Have a baby? But the angel answered . . .

BRIANCA: (dressed as Angel) "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, the power of the Most High God"











SCENE 5

SPARKY:

(enters dragging a wet box) (31 PP 12 SFX-Dragging Box) I managed to track down the Twelve Drummers Drumming Delivery truck and drag the boxes of glitter here myself. (out of breath but victoriously shaking his fist in the air) Glitter!

KING:

(POWER goes OUT!!! Thunder/Lightning, then everything goes quiet and dark)

Wrapping for the King (Underscore 1)



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KING:

(tapping mic but it's not on) Hellooo? Hellooo? Well, (nervous laugh) it looks like we may have a bit of a peppermint problem. Please stand by. (under his breath to kids) What in the little town of Bethlehem is going on here?

CUTHBERT: The lightning must have struck our power lines! The whole

town is dark!! ("Oh, no! What are we going to do? This is

terrible!, etc." reactions)

ANGELINA: We can't have Tinsel Mania without power!

BRIANCA: We can't dance without merry music!

SPARKY: Mistletoe madness! What about the glitter?

[music begins to "Sleigh Bell Storm's A-Brewin' (Underscore 2)" [33] [22] 14]

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STORYTELLER !: Well, things were looking grim for our little town. Instead of peace on earth, an eerie stillness was all around.

STORYTELLER 2: Never before had their land been dark. No Christmas notes of beauty, no songs of hope sung clearly. ("Underscore 2" ends)


(emotional) For the first time ever in Tuneville history, Christmas is ruined! We cannot celebrate Christmas without our lights, our songs and our Tinsel Mania! It is just not done! Backup sing—...ah, forget it. (The backup singers shuffle off)

STORYTELLER 1: Now, Tansy wasn't sure how to help. Then she had idea. So, as Filbert set up the wrapping station, she addressed the crowd.

TANSY: Villagers of Tuneville, I don't pretend to know much about merry music or Christmas razzle-dazzle. But I do know that we can't stop having faith. We need to believe that God is

going to work things out when we trust and follow Him. (34) [34] "Joshua 1:9 - Rap 3")

STORYTELLER 2: And then, she started wrapping. (Starts wrapping small packages with Filbert and slapping rhythmically)



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ANSY:

O holy night! That's more like it! We have gotten so used to the Christmas stories about Jesus' birth, that we've forgotten that these were real people in real situations. How do you think that Mary and Joseph felt when God told them that Mary was carrying the Savior of the world?

BRIANCA: (choosing the "Sunday School answer" with a sweet smile)

Blessed with bountiful cheer.

TANSY: *Really?*

SPARKY: Well, I would have thought I was going candy cane-crazy!

(Everyone giggles)

TANSY: Exactly! She had to have faith that God was telling her the

truth.

FILBERT: (piping in) And Joseph had to have faith that God was using

Mary to accomplish His perfect plan. These Christmas stories are filled with GREAT faith. What a great chance to have faith in God now, facing this doozy of a peppermint problem!

STORYTELLER 2: And as the villagers of Tuneville listened, (music begins to "A

Light Has Dawned" (35) Tansy explained to them the things about the meaning of Christmas that they had forgotten

in all the excitement of the daily Christmas traditions.

TANSY: It may seem dark as a reindeer's nose right now, but I've

seen God work in the darkness before . . . like right before that first Christmas Eve The Bible says the people were lost in darkness, and wanting desperately for God to send them a Messiah. (During song, Tansy and Filbert hand out some little

wrapped gifts to the villagers, who wait to open them.)

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SCENE 6

STORYTELLER 1: As the Tunies all sang about God's Light breaking through the darkness, Tansy started delivering her little wrapped gifts throughout the hall.

STORYTELLER 2 And they were all reminded of a timeless Truth—the Baby in manger who brought Light to a dark world.

BRIANCA: (A

(hesitantly, still figuring it out) So, it's not the razzle-dazzle surrounding Christmas that is so important—it's what God did at Christmas that we need to remember.

ANSY: (addressing the crowd) Merry Christmas, everyone! Did you all get a gift wrapped with joy? (people agree) Go ahead, open

them! (people excitedly start opening)

KID 1: It's a candle!

KID 2: Mine is, too!

KING: Mine is a jingley-jingle bell! (jingles)

KID 3: (grinning) I have a cowbell! (sound)

KING: I do love a good cowbell.

BACKUP SINGERS (Backup Singers sing)



Cow - bell!

TANSY: God gave us the greatest Gift when He sent Jesus into a dark

and dying world; a world lost without Him. We remember His Gift of Light as we open these presents this Christmas day.

ANGELINA: (figuring it out) I get it—we can make merry music even when

the power is out!

BRIANCA: We can always celebrate the birth of Christ—with or without

a big fancy show!

SPARKY: Even when things seem as dark as hot cocoa, God is with us!

TANSY: Yes! Everybody, let's light out candles (optional: turn on

battery-operated candles) as a symbol of how God's Light pierced through the darkness when He sent a Savior to the world. (Characters who received candles as gifts may light them

now, or the whole group may turn on candles)

FILBERT: And if you received an instrument, line up over here and

watch me for the beat. (Those who opened gifts of percussion

instruments walk over to Filbert)

KING: (He is directed to the percussion group, led by Filbert) You mean, we're going to make like the Little Drummer Boy and BEAT

T? (cracks himself up) **HA!**

(music begins to "He Will Be Called" 42 18)

(As song starts, they clap, slap, and play their instruments)

TANSY: Let's make this the best Christmas day ever. Let's celebrate

the birth of the Light of the World!

ANGELINA: "For unto us a child is born,

Unto us a Son is given . . .

And He will be called

Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace."

(Isaiah 9:6)

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SCENE 7

(All of the Tunies clap and applaud when song ends.)

STORYTELLER 1: On that Christmas Day, the town of Tuneville celebrated the Savior, Who came to bring light to a dark world.

STORYTELLER 2: And the town gratefully remembered that first Christmas morning. (music begins to "Bethlehem Skies" [48]

This Baby would be born humbly in a manger. (During song, a simple Nativity is staged. Optional: candles held by entire choir.)

STORYTELLER 1: And so, the Tunies of Tuneville learned an important lesson.

STORYTELLER 2: (music begins to "Finale" [53] [220]) As much fun as it was to celebrate Christmas every day, it was more important to focus on the reason for the holly jolly celebration.


STORYTELLER 1: From that moment on, each day they remembered God's great Gift of Light to a dark world, and the promise of hope to every heart that longs for peace.

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

SELVING:

Tuneville town square; Tinsel Mania is held in the Town Hall

PLOT

Our story begins in a tiny town called Tuneville. The Tunies love Christmas so dearly that the King of Tuneville decided to show the world they love it with all their hearts. One day, King Dazzlebaum made a decree that Christmas would be celebrated daily, a national past-time for the citizens of Tuneville! Every day is Christmas day!

In the town square, Tansy the wrapping Tunie works at the local gift wrapping station. She always taps a rhythmic beat and likes to rap Christmas carols. As she gift wraps each package, Tansy incorporates a rap rhythm through slapping and tapping (much like a "cups routine"). She marches to the beat of her own wrapping paper. When the town blows a fuse during the celebration, Tinsel Mania, and the Tunies can't use any of microphones and instruments, they are sure the Christmas celebration will have to be cancelled. Our wrappers, Tansy and Filbert step in to teach their rhythm and (w)rap, and about Jesus, the Light of the World who came to bring hope in the darkness

THEME:

To a people walking in darkness, a light has come! We remember the advent of His Gift of Redemption to a people walking in the shadow of death; God's enduring love and faithfulness to His people have come!

INSTRUCTIONAL DVD:

Thanks to our awesome new friends at Shepherd of the Hills Church in Woodland Hills, California for working so hard to present the first performance of "Wrapping All the Way!" The Instructional DVD contains a fully-staged performance of the entire musical, along with a step-by-step demonstration of choreography by my amazing student choreographers!

A special thanks to my sweet an Diego kids Choir choreographer Kate Rutherford (10th grade), Loren Rutherford (8th grade), and my son Nathaniel (8th grade.)

CHARACTER

There are eight main characters and several "bit parts" that can be added to suit your program. All of the characters were written to be gender neutral (with the obvious change of King to Queen Dazzlebaum), so cast as many boys or girls as you like. As always, feel free to add additional fun parts so all of the kids can have a special role! some ways that you can do this is to increase the number of the king's backup singers up to six kids OR you can have the storytellers sing the part of the backup singers if you don't have a large choir!



ELCOME TO TUNEVILLE-where the townspeople are known as Tunies, **VV** and their leader, King Dazzlebaum, has declared that EVERY DAY is Christmas! The conversation is loaded with Christmas-isms and the air is merry and bright as the Christmas extravaganza — "Tinsel Mania" — is about to take place. You won't want to miss it! But wait...a devastating sleigh bell storm is about to change all that! How can local gift wrappers/rappers, Tansy and Filbert, save the day?
